Nepali travelers must obtain **tourist visas** for both **Singapore** and **Malaysia**. If your trip includes a **cruise**, visa requirements depend on:

- Your entry and exit ports
- Whether you disembark at each destination
- The **cruise itinerary** (some cruises require multiple-entry visas)

Do Nepali citizens need a visa for Singapore?

Yes. Nepali passport holders must apply for a Singapore tourist visa before traveling.

Visa Validity:

- Typically valid for **30 days**
- Processing time: 6–10 working days

If arriving or departing via cruise:

- You still need a visa unless your cruise line arranges a transit facility
- Disembarking in Singapore requires immigration clearance

Do Nepali citizens need a visa for Malaysia?

Yes. Nepali citizens must apply for a Malaysia eVisa or eNTRI before travel.

Visa Validity:

- eVisa: Valid for 90 days, stay up to 30 days
- Processing time: 6–10 working days

If entering Malaysia via cruise:

- You may need a multiple-entry visa if your cruise re-enters Malaysia
- Immigration clearance is required at each port of disembarkation

Do I need separate visas for each country on the cruise?

Yes—unless the cruise is **closed-loop** (starts and ends in the same country without disembarkation), you'll need visas for **each country** where you **get off the ship**.

Can the cruise company help with visas?

Some cruise lines offer visa assistance, but you are responsible for ensuring you meet entry requirements.

What if I stay on the ship and don't disembark?

Even then, some countries require a visa if the ship docks. Always check with your cruise provider.
