Visa & Entry Requirements

Do Nepali citizens need a visa for Thailand?*

Yes. Nepali travelers must obtain a **Tourist Visa** before departure.

Types of Tourist Visas:

Single-Entry Visa (TR):** Valid for 3 months, allows up to 60 days stay

*Multiple-Entry Visa:** Valid for 6 months, each entry allows 60 days

Where to apply?

- Royal Thai Embassy, Kathmandu

- **Required Documents:

- Valid passport (6+ months)
- Completed visa application form
- 3 passport-size photos
- Round-trip flight itinerary
- Hotel booking confirmation
- Bank statement (minimum NPR 100,000 for solo travelers)
- Travel insurance (recommended)
